Hints from the Fog by Mike Ball, President



We also believe in having the members get involved in the development process of products that ICMM members are working on. We use the whole audience for input and feedback to help with the product development on the white board we use to facilitate our inputs.

Inventing involves risk, but we like to remove most of it by using the manufacturing cost formula to determine if you have an invention or a business. We used this in the September meeting with the Cross Breeze Cab Fan for which we have built a prototype and used the members for ideas to improve the product.

After using the Manufacturing Cost Formula on the white board during the ICMM meeting, it was determined that we had a nice invention, but not a sustainable business. Those that participated understand that it is not enough to make a little money on each sale, but in order to sustain a business we must achieve returns of 50% to 80% for a viable investment and return to make it worth your effort.

We could see that we stood a good chance to lose money at the estimated price point so we will revisit the design, price point, and materials for cost reduction. It is an ongoing process, but I do not manufacture any invention (product) until the manufacturing cost model shows a proper return on investment.

This is how you take risk out of inventing. Forget your ego and only move on when the data supports the return that an inventor needs to make money.

We show that the revenue you receive is greatly affected by the method of distribution you use. If you have to sell your product Direct, then your sales are limited to who you can reach. When you have dealers, distributors, and other selling for you, the reach of your customer is greater, but your net revenue is less.

This is a great learning and teaching club. Come network with other inventors and learn and grow together.

Funding is a big issue for every inventor. We have a member using Kickstarter both as a fund raising and teaching effort. Rick Mason, Vice President is operating a Project on Kickstarter that he will be sharing every detail from set-up to receiving funds.

What a great club that shares so much information with each other in a giving way. Come join us and have fun.
