- _ At the start of a new year most newsletters start out by discussing the things an organization will try to accomplish during the coming year. I'm not going to do that, because I feel we are more interested in helping each other get our products to market and we don't have all year to get that done. So I want to go over a few things that members can do to help introduce their idea to the marketplace. First you have to do the first few steps found in our basic outline of "Steps in the Invention Process" that we talk about each month. These are:
- 1) intellectual property search and protection if needed
- 2) research on competition.
- 3) due diligence on your Price Point.

Once you have completed these basic steps you need product exposure. Here are some valuable opportunities that cost very little or nothing. Spend some of your time and get moving on your idea:

- 1. <u>www.mycoolinventions.com</u> This is a very good opportunity to get your product shown on full stream TV and other cable networks while being interviewed live on Radio.
- 2. Kickstarter and other funding platforms are a serious opportunity to get the cash you need to develop your product while getting free advertisement of your product. Every small investor becomes a potential marketer for your product.
- 3. 100K Ideas: Right here in Flint has local university students developing products for the inventor. This includes helping with patent information, advertising, introduction to potential investors and buyers.
- 4. The Michigan Inventors Coalition Expo: This has grown immensely since it's start five years ago and is proving to be an ideal place to show your ideas. The 6th Annual Expo will come up fast this coming September
 - 5. Youtube, Facebook and other social media connections are great for no-cost advertising.
- 6. Inventors Association Leadership Circle: This organization of Inventor group leaders is working to create opportunities for the individual inventor to develop and introduce their product
- 7. PTAC: If you have a product or service that the government may be interested in, take advantage of this tax funded Procurement and Technical Assistance Center and get connections to sell to Government agencies whether they be Federal, State, or local.

There are a lot of opportunities that you can utilize to advance your product and all of them are good exposure for you.
