President's Note

Last month we discussed an inventor's ability to develop the basic idea of an invention. I used the discussion to introduce our guest speaker from a maker-space in downtown Flint. Many larger cities now have maker-space facilities that are designed to give local residents a place to work on a project, develop an idea, or work on a hobby. We are blessed in Flint to have various facilities available to help our inventors. I have talked of them in the past, but this month I want to talk about what our guest speaker will be presenting about a unique facility in Genesee County. Without going into a lot of detail, what impressed me was the varied factions to developing a product that are available at the Genesee Career Institute. Beside the typical equipment you would imagine, they even have the ability to make large plastic banners, silk screen T-shirts, and more. So you not only have access to developing your idea, but also making signs, banners, and other advertising material. Listen to our speaker this month to hear what they have to offer.

I want to elaborate a little on the benefits for an inventor to have facilities like this to develop an idea. It's not just the lathe or mill in a place that is used by someone making their own proto-type. It's also the networking with those folks at these facilities that give you an opportunity to get "fresh eyes" on what you are developing. Granted, most of the time you will want to have a provisional application or at least a non-disclosure signed before working there, but the feedback can be priceless. We always talk of bouncing an idea off someone, but these types of places allow you to get the feedback of a novice, the person who has no idea what you are working on. This can be a big help in determining how you will design your product or how you will market it. To me, these places are just as important as going to inventor expositions or trade shows to see how products are presented. It just goes with the notion often said, "you don't know what you don't know". Probably no greater mental kick in the gut is to work out a design and package and then go to a tradeshow and see a more unique or simpler way to present your product. Yes, I am also pushing our Michigan Inventors Coalition Expo next month, but I honestly feel you can get no greater information on all the aspects of developing your invention than to see how the experts have done it. The very purpose of Inventors Groups is to network and get feedback on how to do things the right way, so let's network with our guest speaker this month and then plan on attending our expo in Lansing next month.
