# **President's Note**

When introducing your product to market, I continually remind you to list on ebay, Amazon, Google shopping, etc. Listing on these websites is fairly easy, since they have you choose the categories you will be advertising in and walk you through a step by step installation process. They also have opportunities offered to help enhance your product if your choose to add a little cost. If, however, you choose to construct your own website, and there are many "apps" that can walk you through that, you will need to know the critical things your site needs to have for search engine optimization. Though you are a small business, you are competing with large companies and corporations for attention. Here are some criteria for you to consider to ensure you have a good website:

- 1. Your home page has to grab the audience 75% of web users judge a company's credibility by the design of their site. It has to compete with the big boys.
- 2. Your site must be mobile friendly more than half of web users use their mobile device to buy items. Unfortunetly 93% of small business websites are not mobile friendly, and 60% of small businesses don't even have a mobile site.
- 3. Your site needs to be tied to social media over 90% of small business websites don't have a link to twitter, Facebook, etc. It is very easy to link your own Facebook page to your site. Make SEO happy.
- 4. Your site needs to be updated often Search engines like to see activity and customers like to see new input. Add and update your site often to keep it exciting.
- 5. Make sure your website information is correct 85% of small businesses have incorrect information on their site. Nothing frustrates a web users more than finding information that is confusing. Proof read your site every few days to ensure accurate information.
- 6. Tie in a video to explain your product. It is very easy with a mobile device.
- 7. Have the pertinent information easily viewed or found. Such things as
  - 1. List of products or services
  - 2. A Call to action (a "Buy Now" button)
  - 3. Phone Number
  - 4. Email address
  - 5. Days and hours of operation
  - 6. How to contact a real person

There are many things to consider besides the basics I mentioned, but keep these in mind when you build a site. If things progress in a successful manner, you may want to have a web designer update your site and host it for you. But when you are just getting started, any online presence is good for marketing.
